West Virginia colleges and universities offer state-approved educator preparation programs leading to a bachelor's degree, master's degree or a post-bachelor's certificate. Candidates interested in the program are encouraged to follow the steps below to ensure they achieve licensure through a traditional teacher preparation program for certification.

Earn high school diploma or equivalency.
Meet entry requirements per institution.
Achieve identified overall GPA.
☐ Earn minimum ACT and/or SAT scores.
Apply for enrollment into <u>a traditional educator preparation program</u> .
Meet basic skills requirements of the <u>WV Licensure Testing Directory</u> .
Meet content requirements of the <u>WV Licensure Testing Directory</u> for the specific endorsement(s) sought.
Successful completion of a WVBE-approved teacher performance assessment.
Successfully complete a <u>state-approved traditional program</u> including a clinical experience through the <u>West Virginia Residency Model</u> .
Possess an overall cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher.
Meet professional education requirements of the <u>WV Licensure Testing Directory</u> for the endorsement(s) sought. (A qualifying teacher performance assessment may exempt individuals from this requirement.)
Apply for WV Provisional Teaching Certificate with <u>WVDE Certification Services.</u>
